Registration 2022-23

Kindergarten Registration

Registration for the 2022-23 school year is underway online as of <u>Wednesday January 5th at 8:00</u> <u>am and ends Monday, January 31st, 2022.</u> ALL families interested in French Immersion for their incoming Kindergarten student(s) need to apply online by the deadline.

If you currently have a child who will attend Pauline Haarer again during the 2022-23 school year, you can have a kindergarten spot saved for their younger sibling(s)! To ensure a spot is saved for your kindergarten aged child(ren), you MUST register online before January 31st. If you do not register within that time frame, a spot will not be held for your child, and your child(ren) will be placed on a waitlist.

Unfortunately, if you have a child who is currently enrolled in Grade 7, your incoming Kindergarten student will not have a spot held for them. Your kindergarten aged child(ren) will be included in the lottery; providing that you apply before the lottery closes on January 31st, 2022.

Grade 8 registration for our current Grade 7 students

If your child plans to attend NDSS_for Grade 8, you do not need to re-register. All grade 7 students from Pauline Haarer school are automatically set up to attend NDSS for their grade 8 school year. However, if your child is registering for an Academy, even an NDSS academy, then you must please complete the online registration form. Some academies are determined by lottery and some by audition.

If your child is *not planning to* attend NDSS *for Grade 8,* please complete an online registration form for the school of your choice.

Registration opens on January 5th, 2022.

Dress for the Weather

We would like to remind parents that we expect the children to go outside to play during our recess breaks. This is a healthy activity. Thank you for sending your child(ren) to school prepared to be outside in the cold, wet winter conditions.

It is also helpful for students to have spare clothing available at school in case they get too wet or fall in the mud.



School Closure due to Inclement Weather

It is that time of year again when the school district would like to remind parents about school closure procedures. The most common reason that schools might be closed are dangerous road conditions due to a heavy snowfall or ice.

If you are wondering if schools are open on a particular day, for the most current updates listen to the local radio (WAVE 102.3 FM and WOLF 106.9 FM) in the mornings.

We also attempt to put an announcement of any school closure on the school district website (www.sd68.bc.ca), Twitter and Facebook, but our ability to do so could be affected by such things as power outages and technical issues. If there is no announcement on the website or social media, please be sure to listen to local radio stations.

We would like to remind parents that it is their right to make the final decision as to whether it is safe for their children to travel to school on any given day. While the district strives to make the best decision possible for students across the district, there may be circumstances in your neighbourhood that lead you to decide to keep your child(ren) home, even though schools are open.



Student Lates

We are noticing an increasing number of students arriving late to school. We would like to remind parents/guardians that school begins promptly at 8:45 am. Students arriving consistently late disrupt the instruction already taking place and are missing key pieces of information for the day. Please help us set your child(ren) up for success by arriving on time. All student arriving late must report to the office to check in. In case of emergency, it is important that we have an accurate attendance.

Family Literacy Week

During the week of January 24-28th, Ecole Pauline Haarer staff and students will be celebrating Literacy Week. We will be having a Drop Everything and Read (DEAR) event on Tuesday, January 25th, where at a specific time in the school day all instruction will cease for 15-30 minutes for students and staff to read.
