#### Principal's Message

As we move into the last three months of the 2021-22 school year and we begin to return to "our normal", we are once again able to schedule and have the traditional Spring activities, such as Welcome to Kindergarten, Young Entrepreneurs, and Track and Field. We have had some staffing changes this month. Ecole Pauline Haarer would like to welcome Mme. Alena Piper and Mme. Wallin to our staff. Mme. Piper is our Child Youth and Family Care Worker and will be at EPH on Thursdays for the remainder of the school year. Mme. Piper is replacing Mme. Morgan. Mme. Wallin has been replacing Mme. Jennifer, our school secretary, for the month of April. Mme. Jennifer is expected to return in May. We are also pleased to welcome back M. Thomas Johnny, our Indigenous Educational Assistant. M. Johnny had been previously expected to leave EPH after Spring Break. M. Johnny joins us on Thursdays and Fridays. As the school year begins to wrap up, we are beginning to take the first steps in planning for next year. Staffing assignments and class placements will be coming up in May and June. This year's classroom teachers, next year teachers, counselor, CYC, SLP, Inclusion Support Teacher, as well as administration will be meeting numerous times throughout April – June to discuss the best educational placements for students. Of course, parents are welcome to add their voice in the form of letter to the principal. Should you wish to do so, please read the section below regarding *Class Placements*.

In May, teaching staff will be participating in both a Professional Development Day and a Curriculum Implementation Day. Staff will be on site at the school both days to deepen their learning around specific topics: Meeting Students Needs and Indigenous Learnings.

Throughout the spring, facilities crews will be on site periodically to rebuild the retaining wall adjacent to the alley way which leads to the Scout Hut. Work will take place outside of the school day, so as to not disrupt the learning in the classrooms on that side of the school and allow students to use the blacktop area during recess. ## Class placements for 2022/2023

Staffing allocations and class size and composition for the next school year has yet to be finalized by the School District and is subject to change depending on enrollment. However, Pauline Haarer staff will begin the preliminary process of student class placements in the last months of school. The staff works carefully as a team to discuss the best placement for students.

Parents may submit a letter to the **principal** stating the type of learning environment you believe your child would need to be successful. <u>Please do not indicate a specific teacher</u>, but rather frame your comments in constructive and positive terms which highlight the educational merits for your child. Teachers will also be reading the letters. Only written email requests to the principal, submitted by May 20, 2022, will be considered in the process. Please type "Class placement Request for Your Consideration" in the subject line so that the email can be easily identified and does not get overlooked. In arranging new classes, we will endeavor to place students in the best educational setting. Please note that teacher assignments to specific classes will not be confirmed until late August or September. Thank you for your understanding.
